From the cotton fields and the* slavery of the whites to them came jazz, expressing their groans and pains in Congo Square in America

Those huge drums that* they called (Tam-Tam) or (Opamolas) did not beat just because they were dancing rhythms, but rather a revolution initiated by blacks in rejection .of injustice and racism

Even the melodies of those* songs that came out of their mouths at events, churches, and funerals were nothing but screams of torment coming .from depressed souls

As a result of their struggle, which* they initiated at the beginning of the nineteenth century in Orleans, Mississippi, under those pressures, a decision was issued to ban slavery, which liberated humanity and prohibited .slavery



Their dances on their stages* (shrouded on the stage of groaning and pain), with their spontaneous expressions and their cruel improvisations, can only be imagined as a state of fainting inspired by a tormented .and tired conscience

Perhaps the sincerity of their* humanitarian cause is what prompted this tormenting art to spread throughout the countries, and from the womb

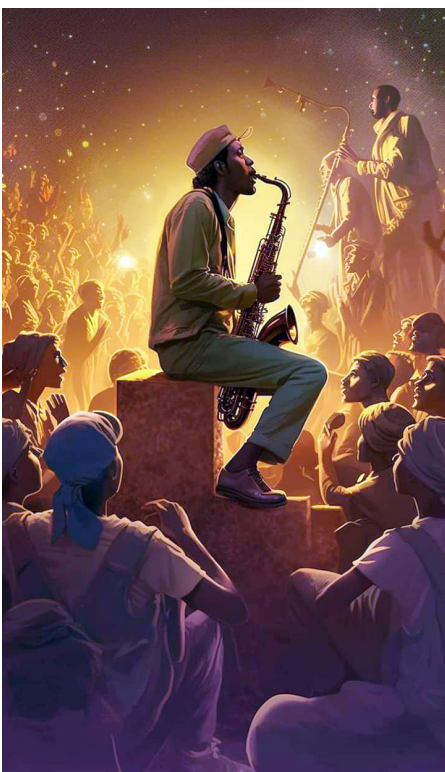

The Sharia, which (its cadres) called Islamic, fought all arts except those who created them (so the door closed on blues music and opened towards Mother, do not be alarmed, the illusion of the .(ghazal, and the pure dialogue The Spirit of Jazz, Kamal Kila, in* previous statements, explained that the Islamic movement fought his art because it called for revolution, freedom, African belonging, preserving identity, .and respecting roots

In general, jazz continues to* call for eliminating differences, glorifying humanity, fighting racism, and singing for nature, love, and the sorrows of life

He also inherits and documents* values and vocabulary written with groans and situations, and that his songs are nothing but chants that fight injustice with .art and call for salvation

Since the war broke out in Khartoum in mid-April of this year, a large number of Sudanese people have dispersed in million 2 various regions. Nearly refugees have taken refuge outside Sudan in Chad, Central Africa, Eritrea, Egypt, Ethiopia and South Sudan, which has complicated the provision of humanitarian aid, especially after holding a conference. Sudan's neighborhood in Cairo last August, which ended with the necessity of delivering humanitarian aid to needy Sudanese in neighboring .countries

As winter approaches, many refugees, especially in Chad and South Sudan, will suffer from tragic conditions

United Nations estimates indicate that the humanitarian need in Sudan has risen from billion 1.2 million dollars to 750 dollars, a number that shows the scale of the disaster in .Sudan

Since I was young, I have been obsessed with discovering and arriving at complex and difficult results and then arriving at a conclusion and getting out of it. With an experience, this is what led me emotionally and intellectually before

.scientifically to the world of chemistry. There is a link between chemistry and life that begins with the energy of the universe and the movement of humans. The circle of events and coalitions, which are primarily overwhelming spiritual connections that represent the law of attraction of things, attraction and repulsion, harmony and harmony, are all axes revolving around the orbit of the chemistry of life, and this is what attracted me to the world of chemistry. I flourished in it and increased my experiences. Through this science, I found many answers to old questions

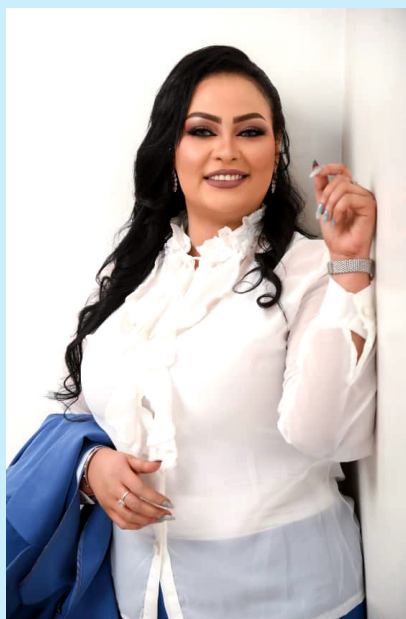

But it took another form with my postgraduate studies (Master's) in plant chemistry (phytochemistry), which is a science that means studying and analyzing popular plants used medicinally and cosmetically. I discovered three therapeutic chemical compounds that I extracted from the plant (Gambil). These chemical compounds are effective for treating infections and antioxidants, and their therapeutic results were excellent. It was compared to the results of manufactured treatments and proved to be higher than the results of treatments manufactured in the pharmacy, within the framework of the Biochemistry and microbiology laboratory. The clove plant is characterized by being an anti-oxidant and anti-inflammatory, and one of its popular uses is that it contributes to the treatment of wounds and fractures. Scientific studies have also been conducted on the

acacia plant (*Abelmoschus esculentus*), which is very rich in fiber and folic acid, helps control blood sugar levels, cleanses the lungs, protects against colon cancer, and takes care of dental and bone health. Cosmetically, it moisturizes, nourishes and detangles the hair because it contains



protein. It also nourishes, tightens and moisturizes the skin and is used as a face mask because it is rich in vitamins A, C and K.

I faced obstacles to reach these results due to the lack of laboratory equipment in Sudan. I was forced to travel outside the country in order to obtain these results accurately.

My life was not only immersed in chemical compounds and university halls, but I also had and still have a passion for music, reading, and knowledge. I read international scientific magazines, I love style and fashion, and I follow the latest trends in fashion and perfumes. I love life and I am addicted to beauty.

I continued my doctoral thesis and was a lecturer for students of medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, physical therapy, and laboratories, teaching them general chemistry.

The closeness of ages between me and my students creates familiarity, love and harmony. I understood their thinking and picked up on their expressions. 29 As I mentioned, I was only 29 years old.

A doctoral dissertation in organic chemistry, which is one of the branches of chemistry, deals with the environment, properties, and interactions of organic compounds that contain the element carbon. It is also concerned with the interactions and materials involved in the formation of living organisms or resulting from a living organism, which is why it is called organic.



It is known that one of the conditions for any doctoral thesis is the discovery of three new chemical compounds that were not known before. I conducted my research on the leaves of the mastic plant (*Pistacia lentiscus*), as they are effective for treating diseases of the digestive system, regulating blood sugar levels, and eliminating stomach bacteria.

It also keeps the skin youthful because it contains a large percentage of antioxidants and prevents wrinkles. These leaves stimulate the production of collagen in the skin and get rid of acne, as they are antimicrobial.

Then the cinnamon plant (*Cinnamomum verum*), which is the bark of an evergreen tree native to Sri Lanka. It constitutes an excellent source of dietary fiber, iron and calcium. It also prevents blood clotting, reduces

inflammation, resists germs, and reduces blood sugar levels. It also increases the body's immunity, and this is what I have proven laboratoryly. Rather, I concluded. Chemical compounds related to these researches and cosmetically work to smooth and shine the skin, treat the problem of large pores, remove dead skin, and increase collagen levels in the skin.

I published these researches in international journals scientific (9) that published papers, and these researches resonated and spread.

While continuing in the field of teaching, I moved in several jobs from pharmaceutical factories to cosmetic companies, and one of the most successful experiences was my work in Fayez Sons Cosmetics Company, a very prestigious company from which I benefited from a great deal of experience. Recently,

and thank God, I launched my own project, which is a company I called (At Your Service). service) Medical Co., Ltd. distributes international cosmetic products to pharmacies and medical companies wholesale.

What attracted me to establish this project is my absolute connection with chemistry, cosmetics, skin care, and natural lightening. I feel the value of my struggle and struggle whenever I look into my children's eyes.

When I open a scientific paper or research by a student, I find that the student betrayed me (as a reference) to the results of his research. Always happy with something like this.

And in the end, my life is a big story whose letters are written from fire and light. I learned that nothing remains as it is and that every soul will taste death, but that not all souls taste life and that light always comes out of the depths of darkness.

I created my present, reconciled with my past, and opened a thousand doors to futures that came to a reality that I shaped with scenes, pictures, and sacrifices for the sake of my children, for my life, for my family, for the sake of my country.

All this silence, patience, and desire increased my motivation even more to achieve more successes. I was in this story like the mythical bird of the phoenix. Whenever the fires of reality burn me, I was born from my ashes a thousand times, and there is no end to me.

From innocence to a bullet

Child recruitment in the Khartoum war

At the beginning of this September, the Sudanese army issued a statement from its official spokeswoman in which it confirmed that they were detaining children in the battles that took place between it and the Rapid Support Forces in the Omdurman area, the Engineers and Armored Corps, south of Khartoum, and two weeks after the statement, the armed forces handed the children over to the Red Cross.

The International Committee of the Red Cross said that the Sudanese army released thirty minors who were captured during the fighting, along with rapid support, in an operation facilitated by the committee in Omdurman and supervised the transfer of the prisoners to Wad Madani in the center of the country.

According to the statement, the International Committee, as a neutral intermediary, "organized the safe transport of the minors overland from Khartoum to Wad Madani, Gezira State."

Katja Lorenz, head of the ICRC delegation in Sudan, said that the released minors are first and foremost victims of this conflict, and she expressed her hope that this process would open the door to more releases of detainees.

Recruiting for money

On an autumn day, I was arrested in front of a Rapid Support Forces base in the Kalakat area, south of Khartoum. After questioning and interrogation by a member of the Rapid Support Forces, it became clear to me that he was a child under the age of eighteen. I took advantage of this opportunity and asked him some questions, despite strict directives from military intelligence for support not to speak. Any individual, with any citizen. I visited this base repeatedly, given that it is close to the market where I go to fulfill some of my needs. I was able to sit with (A.N.), we refer by his initials to preserve his safety, so he could tell me that he had joined the .Rapid Support kidnapping trip

(A.N.) says that he was forcefully removed after the Sudanese army struck the Rapid Support camps in the main areas of Khartoum, which caused huge losses in manpower. (A.N.) says that after those strikes, a large number of young men were disembarked. From Khartoum to the states, to escape the hell of war, we entered a camp south of Khartoum. We were forcibly trained to dismantle and assemble weapons in a maximum days, and we were 15 period of included in the ongoing battles

A.N. goes on to say that they were of whom were killed 8 ,children 14 in battle. He says that he was able to communicate with his family in central Sudan to check on him, and that he is currently thinking seriously about getting out of this nightmare, as he described it, because the smell of blood and corpses has begun to bother him greatly
